Lonsdale Wheelers Cycling Club

The club comprises 3 main groups catering for 3 different needs or objectives:

Those wanting longer rides but at a pace that's enjoyable, no one is left behind. Distances up to c70 miles.

Those wanting a shorter ride at a steadier pace and especially suited to anyone with an E-Bike. Distances typically c30 miles.

Mid-week cyclists who might be retired or working part-time. Distances typically up to 70 miles.

We always choose the quieter roads. This might mean hillier routes, but the main roads have already taken the valley routes & you can bet we avoid them like the plague.

All rides include a café stop.

The longer ride group also organise car assisted awaydays and overnight trips to add to interest & keep things fresh. For example, we have been to Shropshire and the Peak District in the last 12 months. We've also had several weeklong trips to Mallorca (the Mecca for great cycling), as well as mainland Spain & the French Alps.

Membership is only £5 per annum, and we are a British Cycling affiliated club. Club membership can often bring the added benefit of a discount in bike shops, not just local ones either.

Communication is by WhatsApp. The first Sunday of the month is set as the regular ride but there are far more rides organised informally between members on WhatsApp.



In fact the recorder is a very old instrument, Henry Viii is said to have owned 80 of them and later composers, Bach, Beethoven, Vivaldi and Purcell among others wrote music for the instrument.

It fell out of favour with the introduction of stronger sounding

wind instruments but a revival started in the 1930s and now the Society of Recorder Players has over 30 groups throughout the country - our nearest meets monthly in Witherslack. Several professional musicians have the recorder as their instrument of choice.

PLATINUM JUBILEE WEEKEND By Debbie Meikle

The first meeting of the Platinum Jubilee Committee, took place in February. Even at that point, it was great to see so many people keen to be involved, to celebrate this Great Moment in the Country's History.

But, even before the New Year, ladies of Burton In Lonsdale, led by Jennie Sedgwick, had already started to plan a 'Brides of Burton' Wedding Dress Exhibition, in All Saints' Church. This Exhibition would take place over the four days of the Platinum Jubilee holiday. By the beginning May, a number of dress mannequins were secured. More would be needed, and buckets, plant pots, broom handles, fence stakes, cement and coat hangers were converted into "DIY dummies". First thing on the Tuesday 30th May, our ladies started receiving bridal gowns and transforming the Church. The response had been overwhelming and over 50 gowns were displayed, with the lovely stories behind many happy memories.

There was an amazing display of beautiful flower arrangements, by Jane Burns, perfectly complementing the Exhibition. In addition, she put on a special display of treasured photographs and wedding memorabilia which she had collected from Villagers.

The Exhibition opened on Thursday and continued till Sunday afternoon. It was all-hands-on-deck, to ensure so many fascinated visitors had Burton's best welcome. Many people in the Village had been baking and their contributions were invaluable to the success of the Exhibition. £1108 was raised for All Saints Church.

So many people in the Village got involved throughout all our Wonderful Weekend. People took on so many tasks, from risk assessments to road closure. It took hours of planning and discussion, led and inspired by Mike Lavelle, to ensure it all came together.

The Village decoration was second to none. Half a mile of bunting went up around our public spaces, especially on Low Street. Individual homes put up their own bunting and decorated windows. Every corner was adorned with red white and blue.

Proceedings started on Thursday evening with a Coronation Chicken Supper (with vege-

tarian option) in the Punch Bowl followed by a procession to Castle Hill, with the Church bells pealing, to watch the Beacon being lit. What a great atmosphere as Rufus Strickland played Diu Regnare (especially composed for the Jubilee), on his bag pipes. Amazingly, we could see many other beacons, in the near and far distance, all adding to this momentous occasion.

Friday saw an exhibition of the Village's classic cars, (along with two vintage tractors), parked round the Green - the perfect complement to the Wedding Gown Exhibition. This led us into Friday evening's 'Seven Decades Disco'. The Village Hall had been beautifully decorated and there was a fascinating display of pictures of the Queen throughout the 70 years of her Reign. We were entertained brilliantly by "DJs" Mike Biles, Bev Thompson and David Hodgson, who had compiled a playlist from the 70 years – as much nostalgia, as we could ask for.

Saturday morning arrived. The weather was fair for our street party! Low Street was "formally "closed at 9.00 am. Tables and chairs, arrived from all over the village. The street was transformed by 11.30 am with tables beautifully decorated in "Jubilee Purple" with red, white and blue decorations. Our "Jacob's Join" produced a perfect combination of delectable savouries and sweets.

The sun shone – and we spent the afternoon eating, drinking, listening to - and then dancing to – the brilliant "Dani Sicari and The Easy Rollers". There were even games for grown-ups and children devised by three local children, all of which added to the Fun (and raised another £23 for the Church).

Sunday morning brought a joint Church Service with Methodist and Anglican friends, all of us, surrounded by the display of bridal gowns. What a beautiful scene!

That afternoon we had the Village Picnic and Sports, followed by rounders. Despite a change, for the worse, in the weather, Burton In Lonsdale was not to be deterred and there was an enormous turnout. Great fun was had by participants and spectators alike. Each participant was awarded a medal and race winners received an especially designed Platinum Jubilee mug, along with a Commemorative 50 pence coin. At the same time, the children enjoyed some crafting, and produced a number of stunning masks.

By Sunday evening, though tired, everyone involved was pleased that the four days had been hugely successful thanks to the efforts of many Villagers, supported by the generous donations from local groups, to whom, much appreciation is expressed.

A Big Thank You - to all the people who bought plants from me. I raised £177.25 for Church Funds. Mary Edmondson

Special thanks from all of us at All Saints church to Lucy, Claudia & Sophie for their contribution, and to all of the children who drew pictures of the Queen for our display. The pictures will remain in church until September!



NOTES FROM AN UNINTENDED NATURALIST JULY 2022

The last few weeks of June could have been really miserable, with a 'positive' test and then horrid symptoms from Covid. But, caught inside, at least, I've had the wonderful celebration of swifts in our street. Even through windows, they just bring a Big Smile to my face.

Now, at last, I can go out again and enjoy, fully, the avian festival of African Swifts. From Spring to Midsummer, they are Burton Swifts.

In the early summer evenings, the young ones, born here, last year, race up and down the streets screaming their wonderful calls and looping at breakneck speeds - Duke Street becomes an aerial racetrack.

The older ones fly, high up, in graceful arabesques, their scythe wing shapes catching the reflected evening sun, the undersides, a display of copper -red -silver. It's pure joy to watch these displays. High up, or lower down, arcing the skies. Irresistible.

And the adults feeding their young, in crannies under the eaves -we would not even notice them, except for tell-tale white streaks of ejected poo. Last year, I dissected a couple of tiny, white and odourless sacks and peered at the contents, through a magnifying glass: tiny, iridescent brilliant blue green wings of undigested insects. Amazing.

The adults are fastidious at keeping the nests clean. But little excretions are no hazard and can easily be washed away.

Earlier this week, a small drama played out on the cobbles: two swiftlets had fallen out of their eavespace and lay stunned, but seemingly unharmed, below .Their plumage was grown, but the muscles, for full aerial flight, were not yet developed. They lacked a few weeks of feeding by the parents and practising their "wing press-ups".

A shoebox with a perforated lid, was the calmest place to put them, carefully, to recover. My bird-observant neighbour opposite saw what had happened, and came across. We spotted the likely nest in the eaves, and decided it was worth a try, to put them back.

He got his ladder, took one, and carefully went up to pop the little bird through the hole in the stones under the eaves. He said it went in, calmly and easily. He went up again with the second little creature, in his big hand and I saw it go back to its dark home.

Truthfully I was anxious, afterwards, that it really was the right nest, and whether there had been unseen injuries and if the adult swifts would continue feeding. But over the next few days, I could see both parents, darting in, sideways, to feed the young. (The parents have to fly hundreds of miles to get insects, and if the weather is poor 'service' does vary. So, if that happens, both adults and chicks, can go into "torpor").

But my neighbour said that the ingoings, to feed the chicks, were as regular as clockwork. All would be well.



Naturalists have contributed, hugely, to our knowledge of these wonderful birds. I understood, from such a specialist, that it was risky to do what we did, but it seems to have worked (although if anyone has a similar experience of finding a grounded fledgling, it is best to place it, carefully, in the dark of an aerated shoebox and then, immediately, contact a local wildlife centre, for further advice). By the end of July or early August after all the practise of those "wing press-ups" still up in the eaves, the chicks are ready

for their maiden flight. They will leave, very late in the evening to avoid being picked off by predators, and fly, instinctively, south, to take a direct route to Africa, Their mouths agape for insects, they fly thousands of miles, over a few of days. They just "rest on the wing" when they need to. Our "Burton Swifts" then become "African Swifts" -until next April or May when they will make the incredible journey back.

The young one-year olds will often try the nest spaces where they were born. They don't enter but it shows their instinctive memory to return there, to mate and nest in following years.

Such journeys, non-stop, are amongst the longest continuous flights in the Bird World. That these avian athletes stay airborne, for at least two years, without ever landing is, for me, amongst the most miraculous phenomena in all the Natural World.

This is the first of what I hope will be a regular column to keep you informed about your Council.

Starting with a bit of background, the current council was formed following elections in May this year. As only 6 candidates stood for 7 positions, you were not given the opportunity to elect us. Please be assured we will be working just as hard – whether elected or not! You may have deduced that we also have a vacancy for a councillor. Please give some thought to putting your name forward. We are keen to have a full cohort.

Our new council was without a clerk following the retirement of Sue Gregory after many years of service to the community. Thank you, Sue.

Talking of the website, the annual audit of the Parish Council identified a number of documents that should be accessible to you. The Parish Council is aiming to have this information on the website in the very near future.

21 July saw our third meeting as a Parish Council. It is heartening to see a strong attendance from members of the village. We set out to have ten Parish Council meetings per year usually on the third Thursday of the month, excluding August and December. An agenda is available at least 3 working days before the meeting either on the village website, on the notice board outside of the village hall or via our mailing list. The meeting agenda provides for members of the public to make statements or ask questions. We may not be able to answer every question immediately, but we will get back to you as soon as we can.
